

Focus on Casualty - August 2023

The summer months have been a busy time for the Casualty team. We are continuing to grow and develop our specialist practice and are delighted to welcome two new members..

Aidan McGleenon joined us as an Adjuster in Belfast. He needed to hit the ground running, when Deborah Lloyd delivered a new addition into the wider McLarens family several weeks early! We are delighted to report that mother and baby George are both doing well (as is Aidan in his new role!).

Natalie Hung took up the newly created post of Casualty Real Estate Technician. Reporting to Mark Webster, our Casualty Real Estate Account Manager, Natalie is based in Chelmsford office, working closely with the Real Estate team.

A day in the life of a Casualty adjuster is interesting, varied and sometimes challenging!? Here is a snapshot of claims recently received:

- Do you have a head for heights? A visitor to a climbing centre forgot to 'clip in' and unwittingly free climbed 12 meters, before realising his error, panicking and falling to the ground, breaking virtually every bone in his legs.
- Who knew that 'gluten-free' does not mean 0% gluten content? A Product Recall claim involved widely available 'gluten-free' lentil and chickpea snacks. Our investigations revealed that 'gluten-free products' are permitted to contain up to 20 parts per million of gluten. A product containing between 20 – 100 parts per million can be labelled as 'very low gluten'. So even products labelled as 'gluten-free' have the potential for side effects in those with extreme sensitivity.
- Need help with a recovery? A lorry tractor manufactured in Sweden, still under warranty, was sold to a Polish lease company and leased by a Polish haulier. It caught fire whilst delivering cargo to a retailer in Germany. Prompt investigation identified a possible recovery from the Swiss manufacturer of the turbocharger. All managed by Casualty from London!

In short, Reinforced Autoclaved Aerated Concrete (RAAC) is a lightweight, bubbly form of concrete which was used extensively in commercial buildings but more frequently in schools, colleges, and hospitals. It was used regularly during the 1950's all the way through to the mid 1990's and is usually found in roof planks, in walls and separating floor construction.
