NOTABLE ASSIGNMENTS

- Warehouse Fire: Combined claims dealing with Fire losses for Landlord and Tenant for the same insurer following partial destruction of a steel portal warehouse involving its re-build and substantial Contents and Business Interruption losses to bespoke clothing distributor (£1.5m)
- Townhouse development at Stratford Village (London Olympic site): Foul water contamination affecting ten townhouses on the, resulting in significant number of tenants decants (£1 Million)
- Boutique restaurant and guest house: Fire resulting from plant failure causing extensive damage with business having to cease trading (£800k)
- Nursery Fire: Extensive Fire damage to early learning centre resulting in total loss of fit out and business interruption as a result of temporary closure (£850k)
